BOARD ACTION REPORT

September 15, 2013

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between August 16, 2013 and September 15, 2013.

Scanned copies of Interim Stipulated Orders, Orders of Emergency Suspension, Stipulated Orders, Final Orders, Termination Orders, Modification Orders and Voluntary Limitations are included at the end of this report in the order that they appear in the report. These orders are marked with an * asterisk. Scanned copies of Corrective Action Agreements and Consent Agreement are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations. Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request.

On September 11, 2013, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional or dishonorable conduct; making statements that the licensee knows are false or misleading; gross or repeated negligence; willfully violating any provision of the Medical Practice Act, Board order or regulation; refusing an invitation for an informal interview with the Board; violation of the federal Controlled Substances Act; and prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for examination of patients and without following accepted procedures for record keeping. This Order reprimands Licensee; permanently surrenders Licensee's medical license; and fines Licensee \$10,000. This order prohibits Licensee from the following: applying for any healthcare license; practicing medicine or volunteering as a practitioner in the medical field; assisting any practitioner who prescribes controlled substances; prescribing or having access to controlled substances as part of her employment or volunteer service; and performing any surgical or cosmetic procedure.

On August 23, 2013, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order in which he agreed to conduct all examinations of, or procedures on female patients in the presence of a medically trained chaperone, and work only at sites pre-approved by the Board's Medical Director.

8	The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing,		
9	regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of		
10	Oregon. Soraya Ann Abbassian, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon		
11	with a suspended license status due to an emergency action by the Board.		
12	2.		
13	2.1 The Board opened an investigation based on credible information and during the		
14	investigation found that Licensee had engaged in conduct that violated the Medical Practice Act.		
15	On January 12, 2012, the Board issued a Complaint and Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action		
16	in which the Board proposed taking disciplinary action for violating the Medical Practice Act, to		
17	wit: ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS		
18	677.188(4)(a),(b), and (c); 677.190(9) making statements that the licensee knows are false or		
19	misleading; 677.190(13), gross or repeated negligence; ORS 677.190(17) willfully violating any		
20	provision of the Medical Practice Act, Board order or regulation to include failure to obtain the		
21	informed consent of patients per ORS 677.097; ORS 677.190(22) refusing an invitation for an		
22	informal interview with the Board, as requested under ORS 677.415; ORS 677.190(23) violation		
23	of the federal Controlled Substances Act; and ORS 677.190(24) prescribing controlled		
24	substances without following accepted procedures for examination of patients and without		
25	following accepted procedures for record keeping.		
26	2.2 On December 23, 2010, the Board issued an Order of Emergency Suspension		
27	upon receiving credible information on the death of a patient which occurred after a procedure at		

- Licensee's clinic. On December 23, 2010, Licensee requested a hearing on the Emergency
- 2 Suspension. On January 13, 2011, the Board issued a Corrected Order of Emergency Suspension
- 3 with a single change within the phrase of "Providence Health System" to "Providence Health
- 4 Plan." On March 22, 2011, Licensee withdrew her request for a hearing on the Order of
- 5 Emergency Suspension, and the Board continued its investigation.

- 7 Licensee engaged in acts and conduct that violated the Medical Practice Act, as follows:
- The Board opened an investigation after Licensee failed two billing and chart
- 9 audits between November 2007 and December 2008 at Providence Health Plan. Rather than
- 10 complete a corrective action plan, Licensee elected to terminate her insurance panel contract with
- 11 Providence in July 2009. At the Board's request, she subsequently underwent an assessment at
- 12 the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians (CPEP) in Denver, Colorado. The CPEP
- 13 assessment report, dated July 6, 2010, found that Licensee's medical knowledge had numerous
- 14 deficiencies.
- 15 3.2 The Board reviewed ten patient charts (Patients C L) that revealed a pattern of
- 16 practice deficiencies.
- 17 3.3 On December 15, 2010, at about 10:00 p.m., Licensee initiated a medical surgical
- 18 procedure at Licensee's medical clinic in northeast Portland without staff assistance on Patient
- 19 A, a 59-year-old female. Licensee administered a local anesthetic -- lidocaine mixed with
- 20 Marcaine [bupivacaine] -- by making multiple subcutaneous injections into the skin of Patient
- 21 A's abdominal wall. Shortly thereafter, Patient A reportedly began to complain of chest pain and
- 22 shortness of breath. Patient A subsequently had a seizure and became unresponsive. Patient A
- 23 subsequently expired. The Chief State Medical Examiner, who is a licensed physician in Oregon,
- 24 conducted an autopsy and concluded that Patient A had suffered an anoxic brain injury. The
- 25 cause of death was listed as: "TOXIC EFFECTS OF BUPIVACAINE (MARCAINE) AND
- 26 LIDOCAINE."
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Licensee and the Board agree to close this investigation with this Stipulated Order in 2 3 which Licensee agrees to surrender her license while under investigation, consistent with the terms of this Order. Licensee neither admits or denies but the Board finds that Licensee 4 5 engaged in the conduct referenced or described in Paragraphs 2 and 3, which violated ORS 6 677,190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a),(b), and (c); 677.190(9) making statements that the licensee knows are false or misleading; 677.190(13), 7 gross or repeated negligence; ORS 677.190(17) willfully violating any provision of the Medical 8 Practice Act, Board order or regulation; ORS 677.190(22) refusing an invitation for an informal 9 10 interview with the Board, as requested under ORS 677.415; ORS 677.190(23) violation of the 11 federal Controlled Substances Act; and ORS 677.190(24) prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for examination of patients and without following 12 accepted procedures for record keeping. Licensee understands that she has the right to a 13 14 contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised 15 Statutes, and fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this Order in the Board's records. Licensee understands 16 that this document is a public record that will be reported to the Data Bank and the Federation of 17 18 State Medical Boards. 5. 19 20 Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order, 21 subject to the following conditions: 22 Licensee is reprimanded for her disregard of professional ethics, patient safety, 5.1 23 and lack of clinical judgment. 24 5.2 Licensee permanently surrenders her license under investigation, effective the date that the Board's Chair signs this Order. 25 111 26 27 111

1 5.3 Licensee stipulates that she will never re-apply for a medical license in Oregon. 2 Licensee further stipulates that she will never apply with any other healthcare licensing agency in 3 the United States or its territories, or in any other jurisdiction, territory, province, country or 4 commonwealth. 5.4 5 Licensee agrees never to practice allopathic or osteopathic medicine as a medical 6 doctor; not take employment as or volunteer as a nurse, physician's assistant, certified nurse's 7 assistant, naturopathic or homeopathic practitioner; and shall not be an assistant or consultant to any of those practitioners or any other health care practitioner who prescribes controlled 8 9 substances. 10 5.5 Licensee agrees that she will never hold employment or take a volunteer position 11 that allows access to controlled substances as part of that employment or volunteer position. 12 5.6 Licensee agrees never to prescribe controlled substances, perform any surgical 13 procedure, or assist in any cosmetic procedure in any capacity. 14 5.7 Licensee must pay the maximum fine of \$10,000, with four installments of \$2,500 15 over the course of four years, with the first installment of \$2,500 to be paid in full 180 days after 16 this Order is signed by the Board's Chair, and the remaining three installments of \$2,500 to be 17 paid in full every 365 days thereafter. 18 5.8 The January 13, 2011, Order of Emergency Suspension is terminated effective the 19 date this Order is signed by the Board Chair. 20 111 111 21 22 111 23 111 24 111 25 111 26 111 27

9	The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing,	
10	regulating and disciplining certain healthcare providers, including physicians, in the state of	
11	Oregon. John David Hansill, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.	
12	2.	
13	The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board	
14	initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns	
15	to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee enter into an Interim Stipulated	
16	Order with the Board until the investigation is completed.	
17	3.	
18	In order to address the concerns of the Board, Licensee and the Board agree to enter into	
19	this Interim Stipulated Order, which provides that Licensee shall comply with the following	
20	conditions effective the date this Order is signed by Licensee:	
21	3.1 Licensee will not conduct any examination or medical procedure on a female	
22	patient without a medically trained chaperone being present throughout the course of the	
23	examination or procedure. The presence of the chaperone will be immediately documented in	
24	the patient chart. The chaperone shall be medically trained and not a friend or relative of the	
25	patient or physician.	
26	3.2 Any practice setting for Licensee must be approved in advance by the Board's	
27	Medical Director.	

1	3.3 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for
2	disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).
3	4.
4	At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, Licensee's status will be reviewed in an
5	expeditious manner. Following that review, if the Board determines that Licensee shall not be
6	permitted to return to the practice of medicine, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that
7	decision.
8	5.
9	This Order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.265(1) and (2) for the purpose
10	of protecting the public, and making a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with
11	respect to the performance or conduct of the Licensee and Licensee's ability to safely and
12	competently practice medicine. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are
13	confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure. However, as a stipulation this Order is
14	a public document and is reportable to the national Data Bank and the Federation of State
15	Medical Boards.
